Current and past community involvement includes:

Boy Scouts of America: Trey has served as Assistant Scoutmaster, Troop Chaplain, High Adventure Coordinator, and Eagle Scout Review Board Member.

<u>Young Life</u>: Trey and Laurie were part of the steering committee to bring the first Young Life Club to Brenham in 1998 and were volunteer leaders.

Forterra Church: Laurie and Trey were privileged to be part of a leadership team for a new church plant in Cypress called Forterra Church where their oldest son was the lead pastor.

Love 146: Trey volunteered his time with Love 146 which is an organization that journeys alongside children who have been impacted by trafficking and exploitation with the goal of transformative prevention.

<u>Streetscape Ministries</u>: Laurie and Trey volunteered with Streetscape Ministries in Galveston which was an out-reach to the homeless community to provide food, shelter, clothing, health services, safety, stability, and most of all hope.

Tomball Christian Warriors: Trey was a volunteer high school football assistant coach with the Tomball Christian Warriors. During his three years as a coach, the team made it to the state championship game three times and were crowned state champions in 2012.

<u>Heart for Texas</u>: Following Hurricane Harvey, Laurie headed up a disaster relief ministry called Heart for Texas to help homeowners repair, rebuild, and recover from the devastation. Their entire family volunteered to assist with those efforts. The organization operated on donations and volunteer labor that, over a course of three years, helped hundreds of families rebuild their houses back into homes. We also partnered with Mattress Mack to provide them with much needed furniture.

<u>Chappell Hill Chamber of Commerce</u>: Laurie and Trey are members of the Chappell Hill Chamber of Commerce and they attend and assist with various functions.

Faith Mission: Trey currently serves as a board member for Faith Mission which is a local organization that helps to meet the basic needs of food, clothing, shelter, mental health, physical health, and spiritual health for those in our community who are experiencing a life crisis.

<u>Our Daughters House</u>: Trey and Laurie have volunteered their time to support Our Daughters House which is a local ministry dedicated to preventing homelessness and trafficking of young women who have aged out of the foster care system.

In addition, Trey has volunteered his services for the Chappell Hill Historical Society events, assisted the Boys and Girls Club of Washington County with safety programs, and has helped with the Special Olympics.
